

Disaster Area Cancellation Moratorium and Deadline Extensions
Effective: December 29, 2015 – February 29, 2016

The governor of Illinois has declared 23 counties as state disaster areas due to issues related to recent flooding. On December 29, 2015, the Illinois Department of Insurance declared a moratorium on policy cancellations and nonrenewals through February 29, 2016, for **Alexander, Calhoun, Cass, Christian, Clinton, Cumberland, Douglas, Iroquois, Jackson, Jersey, Lawrence, Madison, Marion, Menard, Monroe, Morgan, Moultrie, Pike, Randolph, Richland, Sangamon, St. Clair and Vermilion.**

If either you or your property has been affected by the flooding in one of these counties, your policy(ies) will not be cancelled or nonrenewed during the moratorium period.

Also, any actions on your part (such as tendering a claim or submitting a proof of loss) required under the policy(ies) will be granted a 60-day extension from the original deadline. This includes the time period to obtain any necessary repairs on affected property due to the condition of the property.
